- Chapter member Matt Muniz was named International Energy Manager of the Year for 2002. Matt was nominated by Jim Waltz of ERA. Matt was recognized for his career of innovative energy management especially for the photovoltaic project at the Santa Rita county jail in conjunction with CMS Viron (a chapter corporate sponsor) and Powerlight. - Calpine Tour of the 880MW Pittsburg power plant. This is one of the newest power plants in California to help meet the energy need challenge. This is a high efficiency combined cycle plant Delta is 60-90 percent cleaner and 40 percent more efficient than the comparable power plants that are currently in operation.
- The Green Building Tour of Pier 1, San Francisco. This was a 140,000 renovation of the deteriorated The project had strict architectural requirements to maintain the original appearance and the HVAC utilized PVC tubing in the bay as a heat sink for the HVAC for the building. The Partnership also includes *The Large Commercial Building Tune Up Program* that targets medium and large-sized multi-tenant commercial buildings, medical facilities, hotels, and educational buildings in Oakland. This program offers, at no cost to the participant, engineering services to evaluate the performance of the building's existing systems, recommendations for measures that improve performance, and rebates to the participant to implement those measures.
