President's Message

Are we prepared? By now, you'd have to live in a hole to not have been inundated by media events, reports, publications, and forecasts regarding the 100th Anniversary of the 1906 earthquake. For that matter, a hole (in the middle of a field) may be one of the safest places to be when the next big one comes. This is one media event that is worth the extra hype - whatever it takes to move people to take ownership and responsibility for their fate in a disaster. As you've probably heard, there are many resources out there. In case you need a great place to start, check out www.72hours.org .

Are we prepared for a shift in the national climate-change debate? The Energy and Natural Resources Committee heard statements earlier this month from leaders representing eight big energy companies, including General Electric, Shell, and the two largest owners of utilities in the U.S., Exelon and Duke Energy. Six of the eight said they would either welcome or accept mandatory caps on their greenhouse-gas emissions. Wal-Mart too spoke in favor of carbon caps. The two outliers from the energy sector, Southern Company and American Electric Power, lobbied for a voluntary rather than mandatory program, but they, too, broke with tradition by implicitly acknowledging that regulations may be coming, and offering detailed advice on how they should be designed. Keep an eye out for a climate bill introduced by Dianne Feinstein in late April. (Thanks to www.grist.org for details.)
